Component 2: Developing Skills and Techniques


In this component you will look at:

- Workshops and classes will develop technical, practical and interpretative skills through rehearsal and performance


Component 3: Responding to a brief

In this component you will be:


- Given a brief that outlines the performance requirements

- Create a performance




BTEC has the same weighting as GCSE and is accepted for post 16 and 18 pathways
