GCSEs prepare you for life in one of several pathways:

- Sixth Form
- Further Education at college
- Higher Education at University
- Apprenticeship
- Employment
- Armed Forces

Most of you won't have considered which pathway is best for you yet, and even if you have, may even change your mind at a later stage.

Your GCSEs are a **stepping stone** to the next chapter in your lives, making choices now that keep a range of **options open** is a perfectly normal and sensible decision.

At Barking Abbey School GCSE's are completed in 3 years and end when you finish year 11.

You have to choose the subjects that you want to carry on with, you cannot take all the subjects that you are currently studying.

What does the abbreviation GCSE stand for?

- General Certificate for Secondary Education
- These are the general qualifications.

The biggest problem for many students is deciding which subjects to drop!



Changing Expectations of Universities: Language at GCSE

- Russell Group: These are the best 24 universities in the UK and degrees from these are highly valued globally.
- They include many in London such as UCL, LSE, QMW, Imperial College and Kings College.
- They also include Cambridge, Oxford, Manchester, Warwick, Durham and Bristol.
- Our aim is to get as many of our students into Russell Group Universities as possible, to enhance their future global employment opportunities (84 students in 2020, plus 21 scholarships to the USA)

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Changing Expectations of Universities: Language at GCSE

- Some of our best Universities request the study of a language at GCSE as an entrance requirement for certain degrees.
- Many offer the opportunity to spend a year studying abroad under the ERASMUS scheme, e.g. a year in Lyon for Aeronautical Engineering.

For example UCL requires all UK Honours Degree students to enter UCL with, or have developed by graduation, a basic level of language competence.



Why study MFL at GCSE?

- It is clearly an advantage to have MFL GCSE in order to successfully apply for a university.
- It is the government's expectation that 75% of all pupils should begin studying the full set of EBacc subjects by 2022, in order to increase the number with a Language GCSE.
- 2021 will see Spanish offered at GCSE for the first time at Barking Abbey.
- We have a very strong MFL Department!

English Baccalaureate (EBACC)

- Schools are judged on the percentage of students entered for, and achieving the EBACC.
- The EBACC is not a qualification but a group of subjects: English, Maths, Science (including Computer Science), Geography, History and a Language
- English, Maths and Combined Science are compulsory and many top set students will study Triple Science, especially if they are aiming for a pathway into Medicine
- Students are also expected to choose either Geography or History and a Language (they can choose both Geography and History)

5. Jobs for the future

A scientist who uses genetic information alongside drug development and clinical techniques to allow better medical treatments that are personalised to the patient. This reduces the side effects that are often a result of general treatments.

Weather modification could become an important tool to combat climate change. A cloud controller would use cloud seeding—a technique where chemicals are sprayed into the clouds to increase rain. Trials are underway in the USA, India and China to increase the amount of rain in regions that suffer droughts.

This job would involve the manufacture of self-healing composite materials for use on aircraft, ships and spacecraft. Selfhealing materials are artificial or synthetically-created substances that have the built-in ability to automatically repair damage to themselves without any external diagnosis of the problem or human intervention This would cut down on costs of repairs or vehicles being out of service.

These robotic domestic assistants will work 24/7, cleaning the house, fixing things, doing the shopping, gardening, looking after the children—the list is endless.

This job involves designing wearable robots that would assist and protect soldiers, construction workers and other workers that work in dangerous environments.
